

Observers, voters and election officials deserve transparent and respectful environments for election administration.

Observers can expect:

- A safe and secure environment
- Practical information provided in advance to understand what they are observing
- Comprehensive opportunities to observe all relevant activities within the limitations set by law
- Reasonable proximity or access to confirm process compliance
- A main point of contact to whom they can ask relevant questions
- Answers to relevant questions or concerns
- Respectful treatment from other observers and election workers

Election officials should strive to provide:

- A safe and secure environment
- Practical information in advance so observers understand what they are observing
- Comprehensive observation of all relevant activities within the limitations set by law
- Opportunities to confirm adherence to processes
- A main point of contact who can answer relevant questions
- Answers to relevant questions or concerns
- A respectful environment for observation

Election officials can expect:

- Safety and security when conducting election activities
- Good faith from observers toward the process as administered
- Respect for the legal limitations of observation
- A work environment free from obstruction or disruption

Observers should:

- Support a safe and secure environment
- Act in good faith toward the process as administered
- Accept the legal limitations of observation
- Observe without obstruction or disruption of operations
