Our [Covering Elections and Voting in 2024: A Media Guide](#), published in April, includes six pages of sources for journalists. We now have several additional sources to help those covering this crucial story in the coming months.

Reporters face the challenge of informing the American public about elections and voting amid widespread misinformation, changing rules and what will likely be a flood of legal activity. The threats of violence and foreign interference also hang over the upcoming election.

As always, it's crucial for journalists to vet their sources and know who they can trust for accurate information. At the same time, it is important to touch base with campaigns, political parties and other interest groups — even if they have a partisan or misleading story to tell — to get a fuller picture of what's going on. The key is to put that information in context and provide voters with the most factual, complete and useful stories possible. We hope our guide and this supplement will help.

As we noted earlier, these election sources are only a sampling of the many available to journalists, but they cover the key topics and will likely lead to other helpful sources.
