

# [YOUR COUNTY] VOTERS, YOU HAVE A LOT OF DECISIONS TO MAKE.

You may notice more paper in your ballot packet for the [Year, Election Name] election. It's not an error—this year's ballot is [#] pages long! Prepare now so you can save time at the polls.

Your ballot includes races for [X, Y, Z] and [#] ballot measures that need your attention. Follow the instructions in your ballot packet and remember to check *both sides of both cards* to be sure you haven't missed anything.



## Make a plan to vote.



### Vote from the comfort of your home.

Take the time you need to research your choices. When you're done with your ballot, seal it, sign it, and take it to one of [#] [Election Office] drop boxes near you by [Time, Date]. Mailing it back? Send your completed ballot back no later than [Date] and use [\$0.XX] postage for the additional weight.



### Want to vote in person instead?

Make use of [Election Office]'s sample ballot [Link] so you can research candidates and read up on the issues ahead of time. That means less time waiting in line on Election Day, less time in the voting booth, and less worry about making informed decisions.

*Remember, more paper means more time needed to count. [Election Office] workers will ensure your vote is safe and secure and that [Your County]'s election results are accurate. [#] ballots means [# x2] pieces of paper to process. Don't wait until the last minute to cast your vote!*
